IT IS ABOUT THE CHOICES WE MAKE

Every person has the right and is expected to make choices. God gave all human beings their own will with which to decide what to do, how to do it and when to do what they have decided to do. Coupled with the will to decide, we have been given the ability to think before we act. This is called a cognitive ability. We have the ability to decide upon a matter, any matter before acting upon anything. We are free to even decide on our associations with people. Many times, the reason for making wrong choices is due to impulsiveness. Impulsiveness is usually driven by fleshly desires and emotions. Impulsiveness comes because of not contemplating or thinking before doing something. In other words it can be summed up as being a reactive response instead of a pro-active one. Proactive people are in a better position to directly affect and impact the direction of their lives and also what happens to them. Reactive people on the other hand are people who have to live a defensive life of reacting to everything around them.

There are three types of people on the earth when it comes to being an active participator in your society. There those who make things happen, there are those who watch things happening and there are those who wonder what happened. Here again, it is a matter of choice. We can choose to 'make it happen' or to 'watch it happening' or 'to wonder what happened'. The burden of choice remains ours and we will have to live with the consequences of the choices we make. In some instances you will be part of a collective.

You might find yourself being part of a group that is faced with having to make a choice. This is called collective bargaining with the aim of reaching a consensus on a matter where a choice(s) has to be made. Most times, the personal choices we make are dictated and determined by our interest in terms of personal gain with the aim of impacting the advancement of our lives on a personal level. It is this very free will to make own choices that sometimes sees men or women or children committing crimes and breaking the law. I have found through observation that this behaviour is more prevalent in what the systems of the world call "democracy" because under this system the right of the individual to choose is included in what is called 'human rights'. This can sometimes seem to protect the rights of the criminal more than the victim. Societies like ours which have been 'freed' from oppressive governments tend to go over-board with the 'human rights' thing because of wanting to compensate the people who were subjected to draconian laws.

Many times people, especially young adults do not wish to receive counsel or instructions. People do not like to be told what to do. The result is many times chaotic, wreck less and unruly. When one looks at local and international trends of human behavioural patterns in contemporary 21st Century, you find that people's ability to adhere to and submit to worldly governmental authority is becoming more and more difficult as the scarcity of consumables such as food increases. The information highway which bombards the minds of people on a daily basis further exacerbates the situation because this increases the complicated maze of the institutions governing the world to the point of entangling the minds of people in 'invisible cobwebs'. The result is also a complete breakdown of meaningful communication, discipline and commitment to the realization of any substantial and sustainable vision. This entire state of affairs impacts the choices that we make to the point where we end up being unable to make meaningful choices and a culture of indecisiveness becomes the order of the day. As believers and followers of Jesus Christ, we cannot afford to be indecisive, especially in a world that needs direction and dimension-list leadership. The choice not to choose is also a choice, but a bad choice if you ask me. Everyone is under pressure to make choices on a daily basis. I would suggest that it is a wise choice to choose the Spirit of God to influence the choices we make, rather than being influenced by other people who themselves are mesmerized by their own need to choose. As a husband, father, pastor and director of a number of businesses, I have to make choices sometimes on the spur of the moment. In other words I have to think on my feet because sometimes there is just not enough time to consult on certain matters. My approach is always to invite the Holy Spirit to guide me in the choices I need to make. Constantly seeking guidance from the Holy Spirit has increased my level and ability to discern. Please remember that the correct choice will not always be the popular choice, but whatever you do, you must endeavour to make the right choice.

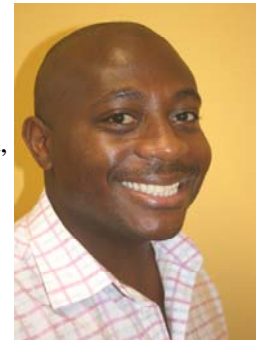
